I am a hard-working and dynamic Speech and Language Therapist with a huge amount of enthusiasm and commitment to evidence-based practice and achieving the best possible outcome for my patients. I am friendly and person-centred, and I have gained a wealth of experience across a wide range of clinical settings including both acute and rehabilitation wards, outpatient clinics and community care/rehabilitation. I specialise in voice disorders and Parkinson's and I am experienced in a range of voice therapy techniques. I am also a skilled dysphagia clinician with a keen interest in dysphagia therapy and improving patient access to dysphagia therapy interventions. I am confident running client education sessions and groups as well as delivering training to other health professionals. I am enthusiastic about sharing ideas and developing innovative ways of working and I work very well in a team environment.

I work predominantly in an outpatient clinic setting providing assessment and therapy to people with complex speech/language/communication/swallowing and voice difficulties. I specialise in voice disorders and I provide cover in our specialist joint ENT/SLT voice clinic. I am responsible for developing and running the Parkinson's service including the Lee Silverman Voice Treatment (LSVT LOUD) service. In addition to this I also run the Videofluoroscopy clinic jointly with my SLT colleagues and Radiographers, completing the analysis, the report and providing theraputic management for dysphagic patients. My role requires me to triage a range of outpatient referrals and contribute to the development of the SLT service across the trust. I am required to function as part of the wider multidisciplinary team and often provide dysphagia cover to the

general medical and neurological wards. I am a clinical practise educator for SLT students from Leeds Beckett University and I also provide observation sessions for prospective SLT students.

# June 2015 April 2016 York Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust Speech and Language Therapist (Band 5)

I worked across the stroke care pathway including the hyper-acute and rehabilitation wards and the community stroke rehab team providing communication and swallowing assessment, diagnosis and rehabilitation therapy. I worked closely with the multidisciplinary team and developed clear and structured therapy plans for assistants to carry out with patients. In addition to this role, I had a mixed outpatient caseload including people with progressive neurological conditions and voice disorders. I also provided dysphagia assessments on the acute medical and neurological wards and in the community, this included nursing home facilities. The role required me to deliver communication and dysphagia training to healthcare assistants, volunteers and nursing home care staff.

# Nov 2014- North Tees and Hartlepool NHS Foundation Trust May 2015 Speech and Language Therapist (Band 5)

Predominantly working on the hyper-acute stroke ward and in the community stroke team, but also with people with progressive neurological conditions in the community and people with voice disorders and dysfluency in an outpatient clinic setting. Use of the Malcolmess Care Aims Model helped to facilitate client centered and client lead goals ensuring therapy was functional and targeted to meet the needs of the individual.

Supporting adults with Autism & Asperger Syndrome with activities of daily living in a day center and out within the community. This required me to be very flexible, adaptable and person centered whilst working on augmentative language and communication skills, computer aided learning, horticulture, dance and drama, music, art and craft, textiles, life skills, work and college placement support, cookery, and outdoor/community-based activities. Activities were based around the needs of the individual considering sensory issues, abilities, areas of interest and the impact of their autism.
